PARALLEL SESSIONS (AFTERNOONS)

We are planning to organize a maximum of 4 parallel sessions during 4 days (Tuesday to Friday)

Presentations to be delivered in the parallel sessions must not exceed 20 minute and will be followed by 5 to 10 minutes discussion. Depending on the paper submissions received, we shall organize sessions for each Period: Prehistory, Kerma, Egyptian, Kushite, Middle Ages and Islamic.

Furthermore, we will set up thematic sessions such as:

- Meroitic iconography
- Epigraphy and linguistics
- Relations man-animal and pastoralism (archaeology, anthropology and zooarchaeology)
- Structure and characteristics of Nubian populations (biological anthropology, genetics)
- Identity, cultural borders and exchange (cultural markers such as lithic industries, pottery, etc.)
- Cultural heritage : protection, valorisation, mediation and perception

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Abstracts must be submitted electronically in MSWord *.doc format to nubianstudies.2014@unine.ch
Abstracts should be no longer than 3000 characters (spaces included).

Each abstract should contain the title of the paper, the name and affiliation of the author(s) and the email address to which correspondence should be addressed.

The deadline for abstract submission is **15th March 2014**.

We remind you that presentations to the Conference will be limited to one communication per scholar in order to avoid proposing a programme too dense. Furthermore, and depending on how many presentations we receive, it is possible that a selection will have to be made by an ad hoc committee.

Afternoon session presentations must not exceed 20 minutes. Morning and plenary session papers should last no longer than 30 minutes.
